## Nature Notes

Week ending December 1st 2024.

## **BIRDS**

Five **whooper swans** rested on mud south of North Binness Island in Langstone Harbour from midday till mid-afternoon on 28<sup>th</sup> when they flew west.

A male **pochard** was at the southern end of the Posbrook floods on 25<sup>th</sup>.

On 27th 29 eider were off Hill Head.

A drake **common scoter** was seen from South Moors close to Long Island in Langstone Harbour and an un-sexed one in the Thorney Channel on 30<sup>th</sup>.

A **goldeneye** was on the main lagoon at the Hayling oyster beds on 27<sup>th</sup>. Others were seen over the next few days at Hill Head and Portchester Castle.

Two 'red-head' **goosanders** were on the Hayling oyster beds a.m. on 26<sup>th</sup>.

A water rail was still present on Baffins Pond Portsmouth mid-week and continually alarm calling; maybe it was aware of the nearby fox. Three were seen on Thorney Island on 30<sup>th</sup>.

A **red-necked grebe** was in the Chichester Harbour entrance p.m. on 27<sup>th</sup> and still around on 30<sup>th</sup>. There was another red-necked sighting in Russell's lake Langstone Harbour on 29<sup>th</sup>.

There was also a **Slavonian grebe** on 28<sup>th</sup> at Black Point and one off the west of Thorney Island on 30<sup>th</sup>. There was a **black-necked grebe** southeast of Portchester Castle on 29<sup>th</sup> and further west next day.

Two **whimbrels** were feeding in the Haylin Hayling oyster beds central lagoon and a **snipe** was resting on the bund on 27<sup>th</sup>.

Around 600 **golden plovers** were seen on Thorney Island on 30<sup>th</sup>.

Two purple sandpipers were roosting

around 400m apart on the rocks below Southsea Castle on 28th.

On 25<sup>th</sup> 24 **ringed plovers** were seen on the Rainbow Bar at Hill Head.

A **little gull** was feeding in the harbour entrance at Sandy Point HI on 27<sup>th</sup>..

**Sandwich terns** were seen on Thorney Island, at the oyster beds and Portchester on  $30^{\text{th}}$ .

Great northern divers were seen SW of the oyster beds in Langstone Harbour; and east of Portchester Castle in Portsmouth Harbour, on 26<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>. On 28<sup>th</sup> there were up to 3 and on 30<sup>th</sup> 5 great northern and on 28<sup>th</sup> a black-throated diver in the Chichester Harbour entrance.

There was a **shag** off Southsea Castle on 26<sup>th</sup>. Three **marsh harriers** were on Thorney Island on 30<sup>th</sup>.

A **kingfisher** was on a branch of cut down tree opposite the repaired breach in the Titchfield canal on 25<sup>th</sup>. There was one on Thorney Island on 30<sup>th</sup>.

Two **ring-necked parakeets** circled high over the HI Sandy point reserve before flying away on  $30^{\rm th}$ .

A water pipit was seen on the Titchfield Bridge St floods and a rock pipit at the Hayling oyster beds on 28th.

There were 2 marsh tits, 20+ blue tits, 5 great tits, 30 sparrows and 2 great spotted woodpeckers all in the same Leigh Park garden on 29<sup>th</sup>.

Two **bearded tits** were seen from the western path on Thorney Island on 30<sup>th</sup>.

## **BUTTERFLIES**

A **male brimstone** butterfly was seen flying near the lake in Staunton Country Park about noon on sunny 25<sup>th</sup>.
